2020 Vision

Typically, at the end of the year we write a letter that reflects on the highlights of our ministry. While we have greatly valued our time on home assignment this year, we are much more excited about sharing with you what our ministry will look like when we return to Kenya.

As we prepare to enter our next term we take with us the successes of the first. We will return with the opportunity to build on a foundation of ministry that allowed our field to



mature and begin to take form into the vision of what took us oversees in the first place.

From the time of originally being called to Kenya, discipleship was at the heart of what we wanted to accomplish. We knew that sports would be the easy part. Just be available, have a ball, and we will have more kids than we know what to do with. The need we saw was the lack of discipleship within the church and via the church to those who do not yet know about Jesus.

This is what Sports Friends does: We develop local church-centered sports ministries that transform lives and strengthen communities with the Gospel of Jesus Christ. So as we go back, where will this vision take us? There are four areas of ministry we will focus on:

 Refugee Ministry: Pastor William is far from sight of his home in South Sudan. Civil war has chased him, and many of his fellow Sudanese, out of the country. We are teaching William and others how to use sports to create a new and more important citizenship. Upon our return, we will be expanding our refugee outreach. There are over 200,000 refugees waiting.

- 2. Coastal Ministry: Chigo grew up along the Tanzanian coast, raised by a strict religious family, that followed the local dominate belief system. By God's grace he was introduced to Jesus and now knows the Truth. He is passionate about making sure young people in his village also have an opportunity to know the Truth. Sports Friends is developing partnerships with other converts like Chigo that will allow us to begin sports ministries in these hard-to-reach communities along the East African coast.
- 3. Nairobi Ministry: Coach Isaac grew up in an orphanage. His experience is not so different from many other Kenyan children. According to "Light of Hope" a Kenyan child is orphaned every 2 minutes due to disease and other factors. Isaac has taken a particular interest in reaching out to these young Kenyans who are particularly vulnerable to crime, gangs and child trafficking. When we return we will be training more coaches who have the same heart for the "least of these."
- 4. Special Needs Ministry: Paul may be blind but joining a team that is run by a Sports Friends coach allowed a dream to come true. He may not see the ball clearly, but our ministry has a vision to make sure that he and others like him have an opportunity to see Jesus clearly.
